



WILLIAM R. GOSKELL
Born - February 26, 1926, St. Joseph, Missouri.
Attended the Stewartville High School, where he graduated, May 11, 1944.
Entered Service - July 13, 1944, at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.
Branch of Service - Company C, 16th Infantry.
Trained at Camp Robinson, Little Rock, Arkansas.
Embarkation - January 1, 1945.
Served in European Theatre. (France, Belgium, Germany).
Engaged in Germany.
Killed in Action, February 26, 1945, in the drive in Germany, on his 19th birthday.
Rank - Private.
Buried in the Military Cemetery at Henrichapelle, Belgium.
Will be returned to the United States and buried in the Ridgeville Cemetery beside his mother, who passed away, March 12, 1926, fourteen days following his birth.
Awarded - Silver Star, for gallantry in action, and the Purple Heart.

Killed in airplane crash of his F-6 Hellcat fighter plane, which did not stand the stress of diving for rocket gun practice and came apart in mid-air.
Memorial services and funeral were held at St. Munchin's Church, Cameron, Missouri, with the pastor, Reverend Father McKeon, and military chaplain, Captain Father Wogan, of Omaha headquarters, officiating. Interment was made at the Catholic Cemetery there, with the Elmer Ellis Post of Cameron, American Legion, furnishing the military honors.
Son of Dr. and Mrs. C. D. Tofflemire. Born in Breckenridge, Missouri, October 18, 1924.
The following poem was dedicated to his memory by one of his closest buddies, commissioned in the same class, and written only two months before its author, Ensign Robert R. Smith, met his death in a jeep crash in Honolulu. This was read at Robert's funeral in Toledo, Ohio.

They told me of the mighty crash - and smoke that billowed 'round.
It all was true, they'd seen it. But what they never knew
Is that someplace they hadn't seen, where skies are always blue,
